Devon and Cornwall Police and Dorset Police have been working together sharing resources (for example: police dogs, armed response officers and offices) since 2015. This joint working is called an **alliance**.



Devon and Cornwall Police and Dorset Police work in the same way. They think the same issues are important, have similar plans to work from and have strong links with their local communities.



In September 2017 the two chief constables for the counties announced plans suggesting how the alliance could grow and improve. They suggested permanently merging (joining together) both forces to become one.
